

### 1. CURRENT SITUATION:

#### A. BACKGROUND:

There were two waves of widespread severe weather on April 27, 2011. They first moved through during the early morning hours across northern portions of central Alabama producing widespread damaging straight line winds and isolated tornadoes. The second wave involved numerous supercell thunderstorms and produced long lived, strong to violent tornadoes across the northern two-thirds of central Alabama.

There was widespread and catastrophic damage in several locations throughout the State.

- Working to connect Salvation Army, the City of Tuscaloosa and PA to collaborate on a possible solution to the loss of the homeless shelter as well as;
- Possible donation of FEMA THU's for temporary shelter as well, while the permanent facility is rebuilt
- Cordova
  - THU's are not permitted within the city limits of Cordova. Ground intel reports that there would not be appropriate space even if THU's were allowed.
  - Continuing to identify any commercial park resources in the area surrounding Cordova.
  - USACE was tasked to identify potential group site locations in the Cordova area







