

1. CURRENT SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND:

There were two waves of widespread severe weather on April 27, 2011. They first moved through during the early morning hours across northern portions of central Alabama producing widespread damaging straight line winds and isolated tornadoes. The second wave involved numerous supercell thunderstorms and produced long lived, strong to violent tornadoes across the northern two-thirds of central Alabama.

There was widespread and catastrophic damage in several locations throughout the State.

Thursday: Mostly clear and about 5 to 10 degrees warmer compared to our recent cold nights. Lows 54 to 59 with a light south to calm wind.

 - A meeting was held with the Lawrence County Emergency Manager.
 - There are two manufactured housing parks in the city limits of Moulton and one will accept double-wides while the other 4-5 pads.
 - The Emergency Manager is checking with the city to see if they will allow new manufactured housing units in the park due to new city laws.
 - The Emergency Manager is not aware of any parks in the county and the county does not want any mobile home parks.

- The county would like applicants to have manufactured housing on their private site until they rebuild or repair and then have the units removed.
- The county states they have their own Forestry Department with equipment and are willing to clear debris from sites to allow placement of FEMA manufactured housing and reduce fire risk.






FEMA-1971-DR Designated Counties: 1600 hrs: 05/19/2011
