

1. CURRENT SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND:

There were two waves of widespread severe weather on April 27, 2011. They first moved through during the early morning hours across northern portions of central Alabama producing widespread damaging straight line winds and isolated tornadoes. The second wave involved numerous supercell thunderstorms and produced long lived, strong to violent tornadoes across the northern two-thirds of central Alabama. CURRENT STATUS/EVENTS:

B. This Afternoon:

Wednesday: T-storms, some severe, moving in tonight, especially after midnight mainly north and west of I-59. Lows 64 to 69, chance of rain 40 to 80% NW of I-59 with a 10 to 30% chance SE of I-59, winds 8 to 16 MPH; higher in storms.

FUTURE SUMMARY/IMPACT:

Thursday: T-storms likely, some severe, spreading northwest to southwest with time. Highs upper 80's north to lowers 80's south. Lows 50's north to upper 60's south Thursday night.

Friday: Less humid and turning mostly sunny. Highs lower 80's north to upper 80's south. Lows in the 60's Friday night.

Extended (Sat/Sun/Mon): Dry and turning very warm. Highs upper 80's/ near 90Sat, mainly90-95 Sun/Mon. Lows mainly in the 60's.






