





County EOC Activation Status Severe Weather: 04/27/2011







1. CURRENT SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND: (State map attached)

A SEVERE WEATHER OUTBREAK IS LIKELY TODAY FOR ALL OF CENTRAL ALABAMA. STRONG...LONG LIVED TORNADOES...DAMAGING WINDS...AND VERY LARGE HAIL ARE ALL POSSIBLE. TORNADIC SUPERCELLS ARE EXPECTED TO BEGIN DEVELOPING ALONG THE MISSISSIPPI-ALABAMA STATE LINE BETWEEN 2 AND 3 PM...AND THIS THREAT WILL GRADUALLY SHIFT EASTWARD THROUGH THE AFTERNOON AND EVENING HOURS...POTENTIALLY REACHING THE INTERSTATE 65 CORRIDOR BETWEEN 4 AND 6 PM. CURRENT THINKING IS A LINE OF SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS WILL DEVELOP LATE THIS EVENING AND TRAVERSE THE EASTERN HALF OF THE BIRMINGHAM COUNTY WARNING AREA...EXITING INTO GEORGIA BY 6 AM...AFFECTIVELY ENDING THE SEVERE WEATHER THREAT FOR CENTRAL ALABAMA.

LOCALIZED TORRENTIAL RAINFALL IS ALSO POSSIBLE THROUGH TONIGHT. A FEW INCHES OF RAINFALL MAY OCCUR IN A SHORT PERIOD OF TIME. ADDITIONALLY...MORE THAN ONE STORM MAY AFFECT THE SAME AREA. THIS MAY PRODUCE SOME LOCALIZED FLASH FLOODING.

EVEN OUTSIDE OF THUNDERSTORM AREAS...STRONG GRADIENT WINDS ARE ALSO EXPECTED. SUSTAINED WINDS OF 15 TO 25 MPH ALONG WITH HIGHER GUSTS UP TO 35 MPH ARE EXPECTED.
