1. CURRENT SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND:

Tropical Storm Isaac has continued to move slowly northwestward through Louisiana, producing copious amounts of rainfall which is resulting in widespread flooding. Maximum sustained winds have decreased to near 40 mph with higher gusts, and further weakening is forecast. Tropical-storm-force winds extend outward up to 195 miles, mainly to the southeast of the center over water and along the gulf coast, with continued coastal flooding as a result. Isaac is expected to weaken to a tropical depression later in the day and through the next 48 hours as the storm continues to move away from the Gulf of Mexico. Total rainfall accumulations from Isaac are likely to reach up to 25 inches in some locations of northern and eastern Louisiana and eastern portions of Mississippi.

CURRENT STATUS/EVENTS:

B. TODAY/TONIGHT:

On the current forecast track... Isaac is expected to continue moving slowly northward through Louisiana and weaken to a Tropical Depression by 7 PM. Alabama will remain on the extreme eastern extent of the broad circulation. Windy conditions will extend across western Alabama, with the possibility of heavy rain bands, strong gusty winds, and isolated tornadoes restricted to areas west of I-65. The threat for isolated tornadoes will gradually shift northward throughout the day today as the entire circulation moves northward. Conditions will be humid with temperatures in the mid to upper 80s through the day.

Tropical showers and thunderstorms and the threat for isolated tornadoes will diminish during the evening hours due to the loss of heating. Temperatures will lower in to the 70s statewide by morning.

C. FUTURE SUMMARY/IMPACT

As Isaac heads northward through Arkansas and towards Missouri, conditions will begin to improve noticeably across the entire state from south to north. Breezy conditions will linger across extreme western and northwestern Alabama, and tropical showers and thunderstorms will be most numerous in the Tennessee Valley. Recovery conditions along the gulf coast should be favorable, although more sun across the southern portion of the state will allow temperatures to climb to near 90, and the additional heat will allow scattered showers and thunderstorms to pop up during the heat of the day in many locations. Showers and thunderstorms will diminish after sunset, and temperatures will fall into the 70s.

SATURDAY THROUGH WEDNESDAY

Isaac will continue to weaken and become absorbed into the mid-latitude weather pattern. As the remnants of Isaac morph with the overall weather pattern, Alabama will stay in a warm and moist air mass, with isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms possible each day due to daytime heating. The best chances for rain will be in closer proximity to this system across the Tennessee Valley. Temperatures will be slightly above normal, reaching into the lower 90s in most locations during the day, and only dipping down into the low to mid 70s overnight.



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


